Consider the kind of job you have

Try a jewel-toned sheath to stand out from the sea of LBDs, and pair it with great pumps. If you can get the cost-per-wear down to a reasonable amount, it's worth the investment."

Stick to a **o** simple palette

"By building your wardrobe around one or two base neutrals, you'll eliminate the need to buy a ton of pieces in order to create outfits that work. A combination like black-and-white or navy-andtan is easy to mix and match. You can always accent these basic hues with colorful jewelry, a fun scarf or an eye-catching bag."

Go for seasonless styles

"If you have a closet where almost everything is fair game yearround, you'll end up spending less over time. Avoid buying too many clothes in seasonal fabrics like suede, leather and brocade. Instead, look for versatile materials like cotton, lightweight cashmere and breathable blends that you can layer easily and transition from season to season."

Don't buy too much

"For most people, a week and a half's worth of looks is all you need for your work wardrobe. You'll have enough items on hand to create different ensembles and mix up your look. Accessories in an array of textures and prints are also an easy, inexpensive way to add variety."
